

Situation Update

Since 17 November 2025, the strong northeast monsoon over the Gulf of Thailand and the Andaman Sea has caused continuous heavy rainfall across several southern provinces of Thailand.

Currently, flooding has affected nine provinces: Surat Thani, Nakhon Si Thammarat, Trang, Phatthalung, Satun, Songkhla, Pattani, Yala, and Narathiwat. Water remains inundated in communities and agricultural areas, disrupting daily life—particularly for vulnerable groups such as children and low-income families.







World Vision Foundation of Thailand's Response

1. Emergency Response in Target Areas

World Vision Foundation of Thailand has launched the **"Southern Floods Response 2025 Project"** and opened a fundraising campaign to deliver aid to affected areas. We are working closely with government agencies and local partners to coordinate relief efforts.

2. Distribution of Essential Supplies

World Vision Foundation of Thailand team has provided urgent assistance to flood-affected communities in Songkhla Province by delivering relief items and food such as rice, dry goods, milk, and hygiene products. Support was given to 10 evacuation centres and 2 churches, benefiting more than 15,200 people.

${\bf 3.\,Provision\,of\,Educational\,and\,Recreational\,Activities\,in\,Temporary\,Shelters}$

Recreational activities were organised alongside disaster preparedness education to support the psychosocial well-being of children. Further needs assessments will be conducted to expand assistance.

Priority Interventions

World Vision Thailand is currently conducting an assessment to identify gaps and needs in service delivery for response and recovery phases. Key priorities include:

Relief Phase Priorities



Set up field kitchens and providing basic necessities such as food, cooking ingredients, and essential items, at temporary shelters.

Early Recovery Priorities



Distribute school supplies and essential household items



Repair and rebuild damaged homes and schools



Conduct Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) training to strengthen community preparedness

Impact



The Thai government has ordered evacuations and implemented urgent relief measures for communities affected by flooding.

At present, people remain in evacuation centres




The situation remains severe across nine provinces, covering 105 districts, 718 sub-districts, and 5,361 villages. A total of 1,099,877 households (3,000,209 people) have been affected.
