Message from National Director

I would like to highlight the story of 21-year-old Tawan, whose journey encapsulates our work at World Vision Thailand. Tawan was just a year old when the 2004 tsunami ravaged through five countries, including Thailand, claiming thousands of lives and destroying livelihoods. His community in Phang Nga Province was almost wiped out, their livelihoods destroyed, and his grandfather lost to the sea that once sustained them.

In the aftermath, World Vision offices around the world, including Thailand, mobilised resources to support the tsunami-hit countries, reaching about 1 million people in the first 90 days. Soon after, child sponsorship programme began in Tawan's community, focusing not only on their immediate needs after the disaster but on empowering families and communities to rebuild and thrive. A kind-hearted individual in the country decided to sponsor Tawan. His monthly sponsorship donations, along with others, enabled us to implement programmes that fostered an enabling environment for children. These initiatives included livelihood training, disaster preparedness, child protection, youth development,

among others. Today, one of Phang Nga's mangrove forests, rehabilitated with your support through World Vision Thailand, stands as a testament to our enduring impact.

When I met Tawan again in one of our 50th anniversary events, I could tell that Tawan has really grown from a timid boy to a youth leader, initiating projects for his community. In 2024, as we marked World Vision Thailand's 50th anniversary and the 20th anniversary of the tsunami, Tawan graduated from university and committed to serving his community in disaster management, striving to ensure better disaster preparedness.

Tawan's words resonate deeply: *"The tsunami took everything from us. We had to start from zero. But World Vision didn't just provide food or money; they helped rebuild our community and empowered our parents and us, children and youths."* Your generosity is not just helping one child; it's building his whole community.

Tawan's story is a testament to the impact of your support and your partnership. For 50 years, our vision has remained steadfast: for every child to have life to the full. On behalf of the children, their families and communities, thank you for sharing this vision, for being the heroes that you are to the most vulnerable, and for the many more stories like Tawan's that we will see together. May God bless you and your family abundantly!

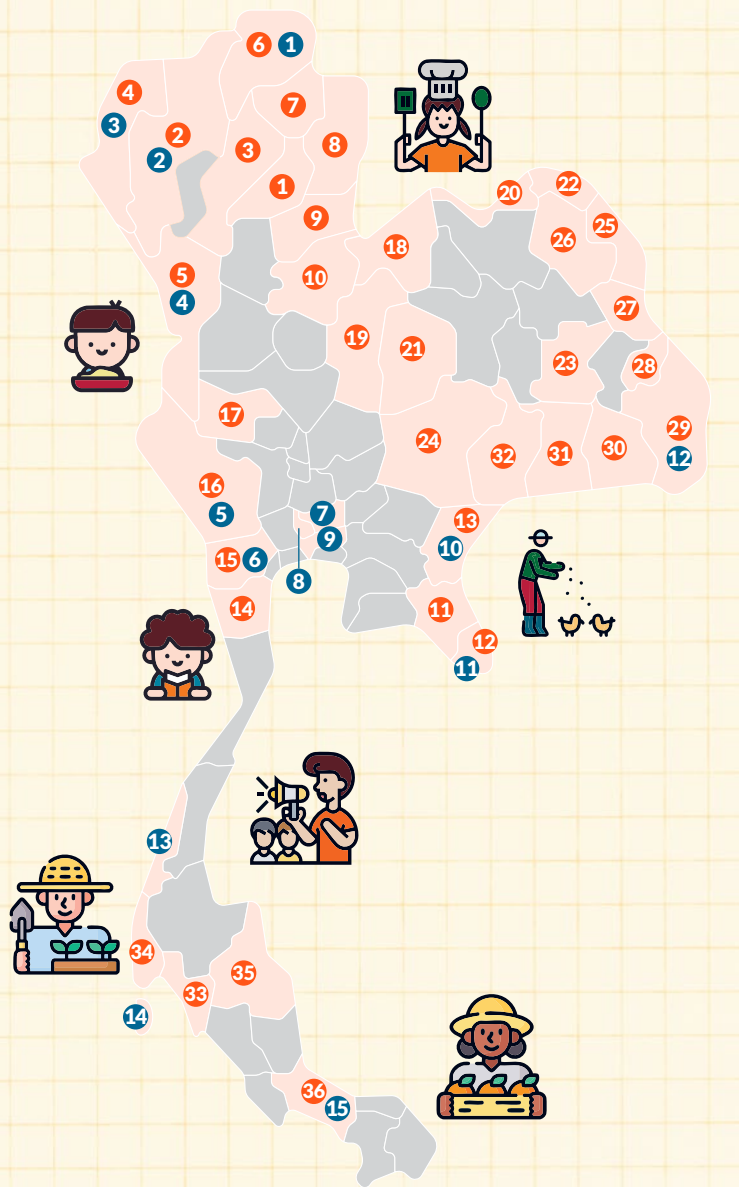

WHERE WE WORK

The root causes of child well-being vulnerabilities, including poverty, continue to persist and remain core to our work. Through our Child Sponsorship and supplementary projects, we continue to help and meet the needs of vulnerable children by working with their families and communities. Ensuring that local systems and structures are supportive of their well-being, helping children remain healthy, nourished, educated, and protected so that their world is a better and safer place to live in.

In 2024, World Vision Foundation of Thailand's child sponsorship programme spanned across 36 provinces in Thailand, supporting over 38,000 sponsored children. Our teams are also in 10 provinces, covering our work with migrant populations and ethnic minorities.

312,000 children, 140,000 of whom are most vulnerable, were directly reached through integrated and community-based interventions on child and youth development programmes, community engagement and sponsorship programme (CESP)

CHILD DEVELOPMENT



World Vision Thailand's Child Development Programme aims to enhance the quality of care and development for children aged 0–6 years and improve the quality of education among aged 7–12. In 2024, the programme focused on capacity building for teachers and providing learning materials such as storybooks and educational toys to early childhood centres, schools, and community libraries. These efforts have equipped young learners with essential educational resources. Recognising the importance of breakfast for students, the Breakfast for Kids Project ensured that school children receive nutritious meals at school, while empowering parents and caregivers with knowledge to better provide nutritional care for their children.

"Before, our family did not pay much attention to our child's nutrition and development. But after gaining knowledge from the Go Baby Go training, we realised how crucial this is," said Da, Mawin's mother.

Thanks to the support from World Vision Thailand, the intervention not only helped promote Mawin's growth and development but also positively impacted the families of other children in the community. *"My child loves drinking milk. Before, he was small, with weight and height below the standard. But now, he has grown and developed well. Thank you so much to World Vision Thailand for supporting us," Da concluded.*


YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

Youth development is key to World Vision Thailand's work, recognising that young people's voices and actions are critical to the country's development. This year, over 56,000 youths aged 13–24 were reached. Interventions include life skills and leadership training, vocational and entrepreneurial skills training, and scholarship for the most vulnerable youths.


One of the key highlights in 2024 is the creation of World Vision Thailand's National Children & Youth Council, which provides a platform for young people to advocate for their rights, influence policies, and participate in decision-making processes.


Meanwhile, World Vision Thailand's partnership with like-minded individuals and corporates also yielded significant results. Three partner schools from Chanthaburi Province received the 2024 Children and Youth Network Award for Climate Change and Environmental Action from the Department of Climate Change and Environmental Affairs, Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment. Their youth-led initiatives to protect the environment through the Trash2 Cash project, funded by Citi, are positively impacting their communities.

'Dream – Wanicha', a World Vision Thailand youth leader, participated in the 'APFSD-Youth Forum 2024' to drive sustainable development. She played a significant role in proposing ending violence against children, supporting education, and addressing climate change. She is also interested in education and promoting gender equality in line with Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) under SDG 4 and SDG 5.

She started participating in youth activities organised by World Vision Thailand when she was in secondary school. She had the opportunity to help the community during the COVID-19 crisis, which marked the beginning of her serving the community. She said, *"Education must be accessible to every child. The community must support education, and government policies must ensure that education reaches every child genuinely. Education will elevate everyone's quality of life and foster their understanding about gender equality."*




CHILD PROTECTION AND ADVOCACY




Mobilising joint action from community and the society to strengthen a protective environment for children is critical to World Vision Thailand's work. In 2024, over 61,000 children and adults were equipped to protect themselves from abuse and exploitation, while supporting community actors to work together using local solutions and evidence-based approaches to address the root causes of violence against children. World Vision Thailand also relentlessly worked to strengthen policies and systems through the following: contribution to the amendments in civil codes related to child protection; support to the regional advocacy for children's rights including UNCRC General Comment No.26 which pushed for a safer, more child-friendly environment; led initiatives on National Child Protections Action Plans, child safeguarding and gender diversity rights, while finalising policy recommendations from innovative policy prototypes.

In Sirattana District, Sisaket Province, over 70% of children lack parental care, putting them at risk of engaging in risky behaviors and substance abuse. To address this, a local school and Sub-district Administrative Organisation have initiated **"Drug Abuse Awareness Training for Students"** and **"Ending All Forms of Violence Campaign."** These initiatives were supported by World Vision Thailand, which provides additional knowledge, aiming to reduce risky behaviours, instil discipline, and promote understanding of safe spaces within the family.

In addition, the programme has expanded to the district level through collaboration with 26 schools and 7 Subdistrict Administrative Organisations to establish a **"District-Level Vulnerable Children Support Fund."** This fund is designed to provide long-term and sustainable protection for children.


Today, the people of Sirattana no longer face these challenges alone. They are joining forces across all sectors to transform despair into new opportunities. Children are beginning to have safe spaces to grow and the future they truly deserve.

FOOD SECURITY, LIVELIHOODS AND CLIMATE ACTION





In 2024, World Vision Thailand has reached over 24,500 individuals through integrated interventions that not only ensure food security and strengthen economic resilience at the household level but also fosters a network that helps build a foundation for communities to thrive.

The organised savings group scaled up with at least 10 functional groups providing access to community-based credit and loans for various needs. This year also highlights the communities gaining a deeper understanding of climate change and adapting their livelihoods and practices to better care for the environment.

'August' is an example of the change from small but impactful giving. The boy lives with his family, who are poor and face many hardships.

With the help of World Vision Thailand, his family was provided with hens, along with support from their community that allowed them to access clean water and the waste incinerator. Their lives have greatly improved.

This support not only improved August's family's living conditions but also benefited the entire community, leading to a sustainable improvement in everyone's quality of life.

When the staff visited August again, he excitedly showed them the results of the support. *"Look, these are the hens you gave to my family. They are laying eggs very well now. I am very excited to collect the eggs myself. Thank you so much for helping my family back then."*



HUMAN MOBILITY AND MIGRATION

World Vision Thailand's programme on human mobility and safe migration is dedicated to addressing the needs of the most vulnerable migrant populations in Thailand, focusing on three strategic priorities: migrant health, human trafficking and decent work, and women and children affected by migration. In 2024, our interventions have reached over 128,000 adults and 11,000 migrant children.

World Vision Thailand is an active member of global and national committees related to human mobility and migration. Internationally, it collaborates on malaria elimination (ALIGHT: Malaria Free Mekong) and TB control (Stop TB Partnership/WHO). Nationally, World Vision Thailand serves on key Thai Ministry of Public Health committees on migrant health, TB/HIV referral, and epidemic response. On counter human trafficking – World Vision Thailand sits on the National COMMIT task-force against trafficking in persons and the child-safe tourism steering committee, among a range of other working groups and partnerships.

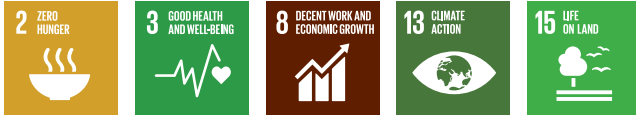

"I'm grateful for the help I received. Without it, I might not have survived, as I wouldn't have been able to access a doctor or receive any treatment. Migrant health volunteers (MHV) and World Vision Thailand staff assisted me by taking me to the doctor, offering advice, providing encouragement, and covering the cost of my children's screening tests, as they were considered a high-risk group without entitlement to health services. I am now nearing the completion of my treatment and no longer have TB symptoms," said Khamnuan, a Myanmar migrant in Chiang Rai, supported by the Stop TB and AIDS project.


DISASTER RESPONSE




Before, during, and after a disaster, World Vision Foundation of Thailand stands with communities in need.

In 2024, widespread flooding affected multiple provinces across Thailand, causing damages to homes, schools, and livelihoods. The disaster posed serious risks to the safety and well-being of children and families.

World Vision Thailand responded immediately, mobilising emergency relief to deliver life-saving support. We provided essential supplies including food, clean water, hygiene kits, and temporary shelter to affected households. Recognising the long-term impact on children's education, World Vision Thailand, through the generosity of donors and partners, also supported the repair of damaged classrooms and water systems, and distributed school supplies to ensure that learning could continue.

"It was a difficult time. Our family had to take shelter at the temple for over a month because the floodwaters were high and our home was severely damaged," said Khiaing Zar Myint, mother of 9-year-old Theethat, recounting the impact of massive flooding in late 2024. *"Everything at home was destroyed. I could not work either because my workplace was also flooded. We had no income."*

Through World Vision Foundation of Thailand's North Floods Response, relief items, including food, water, essential household items were distributed. Educational supplies were provided to students to help them return to school as normal.

"Thank you for giving me school supplies. I will study hard," said Theethat.

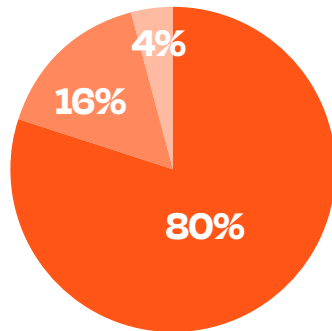

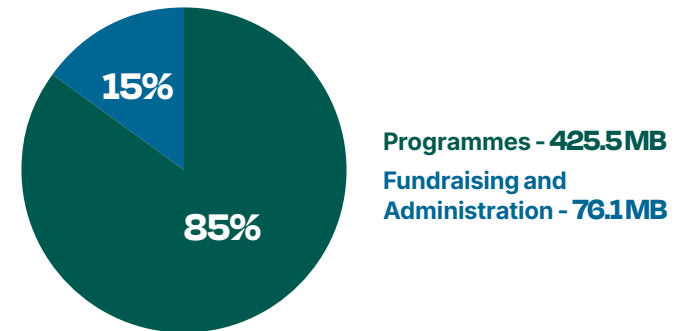
